Korea Research Institute at the University of New South Wales (KRI@UNSW), formerly Korea-Australasia Research Centre (KAREC), is completing a National Asian Languages and Studies in Schools Program (NALSSP) project, funded by the Commonwealth Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations (DEEWR). Commencing on September 2009, UNSW NALSSP Project has been focusing on Korean, especially on the development of teaching and learning materials for Korean language studies at an intermediate level and materials that can be used in humanities and social sciences classes, on teacher support, and on the promotion of Korean language and studies education. As the first milestone of the project, KRI@UNSW hosted the 1st National Strategic Conference on 19-21 November 2009. The conference provided an opportunity for participants to examine issues and challenges being faced by Australia's Korean language and studies education, constructively discuss strategies to establish a strong framework for its future development and to establish an initial networks of stakeholders throughout Australia. The project is now in its final stage. In order to discuss how the outcomes of the project can pave the way for a better future for Australia's Korean language and studies education, the 2nd National Strategic Conference will be held on 14 July 2011 at UNSW.
